In the same year, Radiofrance featured his insights on the technical elements of bebop - the 1940's jazz delivery style of the greats, like Charlie Parker.

He has crafted musical phrases described as "breathtaking" and compositions that are "rich, intelligent yet universally accessible" (Michael Valeanu). I love making music because I can travel through places that don't exist on earth to sonic spaces where pure expression takes flight, where I feel free.

As a French-born artist and now New York City jazz scene composer and saxophonist, I infuse my worlds into my music. I create in the flow of experimentation, allowing an experience, thought, emotion or dream lingering in my mind to take form in a piano progression. Then, allowing each arrangement of notes to unfold organically, revealing itself and evolving into unexpected directions – into fully realized compositions – seeking for the stories untold, both on stage and in the studio and sometimes just in time to be captured on record.

Music is the voice of balance in a world of diversity. And Jazz, to truly hear and understand it, one must remain open— to the flow of the inner tempo, the exploration of identity, vulnerability, and the beauty found in imperfection, both individually and collectively. The in-between note, the off-beat tempo and the harmonic vibe that perfectly blends in chaos and calm. It's a fusion of introspection and observation, anchoring you in the present moment.

In my endeavor to create musical journeys that move, transform and transcend, I offer you a glimpse, an invitation – to travel in the way that I do when I play and create, to tap into the energy of the collective sound and embark on a transformative journey, into the unexplored parts of your being.






